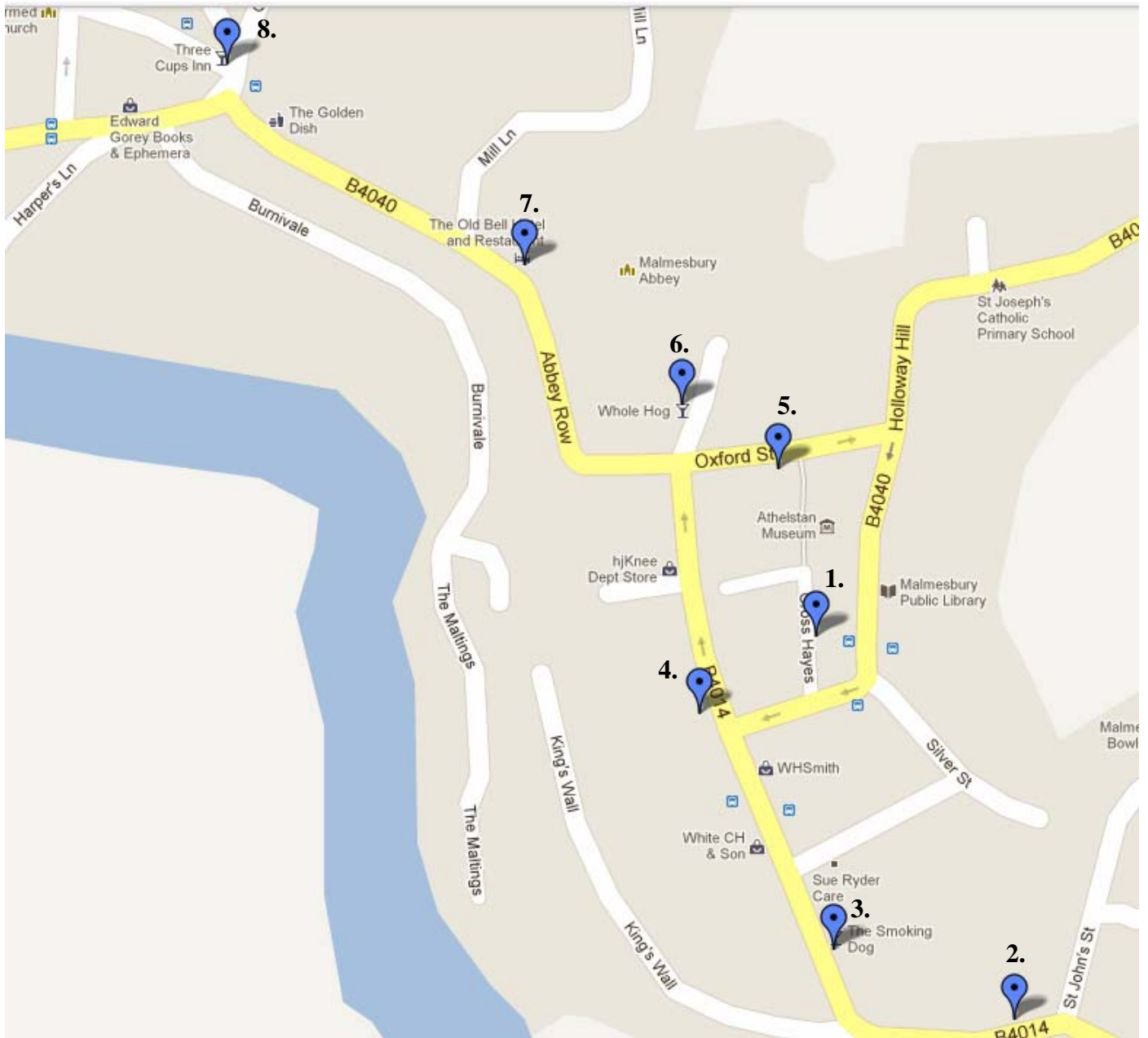


Malmesbury - Real ale pubs
